Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he. [Proverbs 29:18]

Canvas Nights

The evening air is warm. As the sun gets ready to set, automobiles begin arriving and being parked in rows in front of the brightly-illuminated, blue and white tent with curtains rolled up in the front welcoming all that approach to enter.

Men, women, and children carrying Bibles and blankets (for the little ones) file quietly under the large, airy tent and find their way down the grassy aisles sprinkled with the saw shavings and along the wood or metal folding chairs past people fanning themselves with handheld fans (both because of the heat and to keep away flying insects). There is an air of excitement and anticipation mixed with a respectful reverence which to some might seem unusual for this setting on what was usually an empty, overgrown field beside the familiar highway traveled daily to school, work, and home. Neighbors and strangers alike smile, nod, and offer the occasional handshake of greeting.

Noticeably, along with the crickets that have started their chirping, there are many voices speaking at once, some loud, some low and yet fervent; however, they aren't directed to each other in conversations about the weather or the latest sport's victory or defeat. With some sitting, some kneeling on the ground at their chairs or along the wooden altars at the front of the platform (which is centered along the back of the tent facing those gathered for this occasion), their voices rise together in a symphony of earnest supplication and praise to the One being invited to fill this makeshift temple with curtains flapping in the wind, as in the days of Moses, with His presence, His glory, and with needed salvation and healing.

As the almost electric expectancy begins to build, music begins to reverberate through the night air and beyond the tent, with songs such as "What a Might God we Serve"; "Oh, How I love Jesus"; and "There is Room at the Cross for You". Voices, along with arms, are raised in song and worship. Testimonies of God's goodness, along with words of encouragement and exhortation, are interspersed between the songs of praise lifting those seeking the spiritual above the carnal to new heights of joy and peace.

As the preacher approaches the cross-shaped pulpit and opens his Bible, the music comes to a quiet end, banners stretched along the back of the platform softly flutter behind him proclaiming in bright red letters that read "Jesus Christ, is the Same Yesterday, Today, and Forever", and the diverse congregation looks on in respect and readiness for the special message this man of God will be delivering. Some, here and there under the big top, still can't help but continue to utter a worshipful, "praise be to God" and "thank you, Jesus", lingering from the worship service. The preacher delivers his message with conviction and authority but at the same time with compassion and love, much like those delivered by the Lord that called him.

The spoken, Spirit-inspired words strike to the heart of individuals across the aisles and as the preacher asks for those desiring a closer walk with Jesus, those seeking forgiveness with true repentance, and those desiring some type of healing to come forward, another song of quiet supplication begins to again drift through the night air and into Heaven. Now has come the time in the revival service for many to find the deliverance they have sought and for which prayers have been offered on their behalf for some time before the revival meeting even came to town. Tears flow down the smiling faces of those experiencing for the first time the feeling of freedom from the chains of sin, sickness, and fear! Some even rush to the metal watering trough, freshly-painted white and filled with water, so that they might be baptized, publicly baring witness of their resurrection in the newness of life made possible by the sacrifice of God's only begotten Son, Jesus the Christ! A building crescendo of joyful praises almost lifts the tent from its poles and stakes as life-altering events are witnessed from one side to the other of this tabernacle raised in hope on a vacant lot in the middle of a town desperately needing this night of divine visitation.

Thus are the memories of someone that remembers these "canvas nights" vividly and with sincere fondness. Such nights under a canvas or vinyl tent are not so common these days, most tents seen today are promoting "fireworks" of a completely different sort. I can only hope, pray, and believe that if you have not already experienced such a heavenly meeting with God in the night air under a tent, that one day you will.

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Two secret churches in North Korea show how powerful the Bible really is

In the early morning light, a small group of North Korean believers meets on the riverbank, lugging their fishing gear with them.

Quietly, they load into a small boat and push off from land. It's not until they're far into the middle of the river that they dare to dig through their gear and pull out their Bibles.

This is the only place where they feel safe enough to worship together and study God's Word. And even then, they are constantly on alert.

If they are caught reading the Bible, they could immediately be sentenced to 15 years in a labor camp – or worse. They've heard the stories of what happens to people who are heard speaking the name of Jesus. Many of them have family members and friends who are living in the camps now - or have been buried there.

That's why when another boat approaches, they panic and scramble to hide their Bibles. "It's the police!" someone shouts.

Only after the man in the boat greets them in the name of Jesus and tells them he has a gift for them do they start to calm down. He asks to see their Bibles, and the believers who own one hand them to him. There are only a few Bibles among the church members – not nearly enough for everyone. And each copy is practically falling apart. After years of being carefully studied and then hidden over and over again, the bindings have come loose and pages are beginning to slip out. Many of the Bibles have water damage from these early morning meetings on the boat. But they are still these Christians' prized possessions . . . they risk their lives for these Bibles.

So when the stranger pulls out a box of new Bibles provided by generous donors, there is an immediate celebration on the boat. The believers clutch God's Word to their chests and many of the people who had not had one previously break down into tears. To them, a new Bible is the greatest gift they could receive.

There are still countless believers across this dark nation who are desperate for Bibles. Some people have never even seen a copy of the Scriptures in their life - but they know they would do anything to get their hands on one.

After the man delivered the new Bibles to the secret church on the river, he took the damaged copies back to the hotel where he was staying and hid them. But soon afterward, they disappeared.

He later discovered the janitor had found the Bibles. Instead of reporting them, he took them. It turns out that he was a Christian himself, and his tiny house church of four people had been praying for Bibles.

He praised God for the Bibles – even as damaged and falling apart as they were – because he and his friends could finally study God's Word for themselves. That's how

desperate North Korean Christians are for copies of Scripture!

The story above is true. We heard it from our partners – defectors among them – who help us smuggle Bibles into North Korea. They also told us the No. 1 request from the church in North Korea was getting more Bibles. So, a year ago we set the goal of sending 100,000 Bibles to North Korea. It was both a daunting and ambitious goal, but we knew these Christians are longing for a chance to have a Bible, despite the risks.

A year later, we are not far from reaching our goal. With the help of generous supporters more Christians in North Korea now have access to a Bible of their own.

November 4, is the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. Christians in America and across the world will dedicate time in their services and personally to pray for those who are suffering persecution because of their faith. I hope you will join us in praying for these brave men and women.
